SPECIAL AWARDS

The Michael R. Phillips Perpetual Sportsmanship Trophy

This award is presented each year in loving memory of Michael R. Phillips, a dedicated horseman and friend, former Board Member of Reindancer, and supporter of our horse show series. This award will be presented to a competitor at the Reindancer Schooling Show Series that sets an example to others of good Sportsmanship in fairness, courage, persistence, respect, and a sense of fellowship with other competitors. Competitors should be nominated by a member of the horse show staff or their trainer. Nominations should be in the writing stating why the competitor should be considered for the award. Essays will be accepted by horse show staff until August 1st. The trophy will be presented to the recipient at our year end show.

The Abigail Sophia Porpora "Small but Strong" Perpetual Pony Trophy

This award is presented each year in honor of Abigail Sophia Porpora, a two year old girl battling, among other medical concerns, Necrotizing Enterocolitis (the death of intestinal tissue), what was diagnosed as fatal illness. Despite not being able to physically be around them, Abby has a true love for ponies. Abby may be small, but she is truly strong. Her fight to live is exceptional, and her ability to overcome is extraordinary. This trophy will be awarded to a rider and pony who exhibit not only the ability to overcome exceptional circumstances, but also exhibit an outstanding standard of horsemanship and passion for the sport. The horse show staff, along with the Porpora family, will choose a recipient for this award. The trophy will be presented to the recipient at our year end show.

*All Equitation Classes: *Judged on overall correctness of rider including hands, seat, leg as well as the horse rider combination.*

*All Pleasure Classes: *Judged on the overall performance of horse and rider. Horses are evaluated on quality of movement while staying quiet and calm, traveling on correct rein contact.*

Academy Division

Open to adults & children who participate in a PATH therapeutic riding academy. English or Western. Division can be divided if needed.

Junior English - 9:00AM Start

Leadline Division

Open to riders who have not reached their 10th birthday as of December 1, 2017. Open to English riders.

- 5A) Leadline Walk
- 6A) Leadline Walk/Trot
- 7A) Leadline off lead – *May be asked to perform simple task.*

Mini Stirrup Division

Open to riders who have not reached their 11th birthday as of December 31, 2017. Open to English and Western riders. Rider may not cross enter into Short Stirrup.

- 8A) Mini Stirrup Walk/Trot Equitation
- 9A) Mini Stirrup Walk/Trot Pleasure
- 10A) Mini Stirrup Pattern – *Simple pattern to be performed*

Short Stirrup Division

Open to riders who have not reached their 13th birthday as of December 31, 2017. Rider may not cross enter into Mini Stirrup.

- 11A) Short Stirrup Walk/Trot/Canter Equitation
- 12A) Short Stirrup Walk/Trot/Canter Pleasure
- 13B) Short Stirrup Hunter Hack – *Riders to Trot or Canter a course of two jumps and halt*

English Classes - ~10:00AM Start

Pre-Children's Hunter Division (2'6 Horses; 2' Ponies)

Open to adults and children riding horses or ponies. Fences at 2'6 for horses and 2' for ponies.

- 2B) Schooling Hunter Over Fences
- 3B) Schooling Hunter Over Fences
- 4A) Schooling Hunter under Saddle

Cross Rail Hunter Division

Open to adults and children. Fences will not exceed 18", to be shown at trot or canter.

Senior English Flat Division

Open to all English Riders 18 years and older.

- 12A) Walk/Trot/Canter Pleasure

Junior English Flat Division

Open to all English Riders 17 years of age and younger.

- 15A) Walk/Trot Pattern
- 16A) Walk/Trot/Canter Equitation

Showmanship & Western - 9:00AM Start

1C) Open Showmanship & Grooming

Designed to judge the showmanship skills of the exhibitors. Judges evaluate the grooming and fitting of the horse, and expertise of the exhibitor in presenting the horse. Each exhibitor is required to perform a pattern designed by the show staff with emphasis on preciseness of pattern and degree of confidence exhibited by the showman.

Leadline Division

Open to Western riders who have not reached their 10th birthday as of December 1, 2017.

- 2C) Leadline Walk
- 3C) Leadline Walk/Jog
- 4C) Leadline off lead – *May be asked to perform simple task.*

Beginner Rider Western Division

Open to Beginner Western riders who have not reached their 13th birthday as of December 31, 2017. May not cross enter into Junior Western.

- 5C) Western Walk/Jog Pleasure
- 6C) Western Walk/Jog Equitation
- 7C) Western Horsemanship - *Rider will be required to perform a set pattern, which will be judged on accuracy and consistency at the jog.*

Junior Western Division

Open to all Western Riders 17 years of age and younger.

- 8C) Western Walk/Jog Pleasure
- 9C) Western Walk/Jog Equitation
- 10C) Western Walk/Jog/Lope Ranch Riding
- 11C) Trail Class

Senior Western Division

Open to all Western Riders 18 years and older.

- 12C) Western Walk/Jog Pleasure
- 13C) Western Walk/Jog Equitation
- 14C) Western Walk/Jog/Lope Ranch Riding
- 15C) Trail Class

Open Classes

Open to all English and Western Riders. Division to begin at the completion of the English and Western Classes.

SHOW RULES

- All Youth – 18 and Under exhibitors are required to wear protective head gear while mounted. This is a facility rule. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until his/her headgear is properly in place.
- NO Refunds on scratched classes.
- Therapeutic \$5.00/class, Open \$12.00/class
- Stall rentals \$20/day *Please call in advance to reserve*
- Show attire not necessary, collared shirts & boots required.
- Stallions are prohibited.
- Any unruly or unsound animal (lame) horse may be asked to leave the ring at the judge's OR show management discretion.
- Sick animals will be sent home immediately. Animals with a cough, temperature or otherwise showing signs of illness should not be taken to the show.
- This is a schooling show and is open to horses/ponies of all breeds.
- The judge's decision will be final in all classes.
- A current negative Coggins must be presented at time of registration (no older than 24 months).
- No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on show grounds.
- All complaints must go through the Show management.
- Classes with less than three entries may be canceled or combined.
- Classes are pinned 1st - 6th with Grand & Reserve for each division
- Championship and Reserve Championship will be given in each division. Championships will be determined by points as follows: 1st place 7 points, 2nd place 5 points, 3rd place 4 points, 4th place 3 points, 5th place 2 points, 6th place 1 point.
- Martingales are not permitted in under saddle classes.
- Schooling during show is permitted during announced schooling breaks, or when a ring is not being used.
- Laurita Equestrian Center, Rein Dancer Therapeutic Riding Center, employees & volunteers will not be responsible for damage, injury, or loss to any person, animal, or property of exhibitors or spectators. It shall be a condition of entrance to the grounds that this is agreed.
